Over 8 weeks, you will learn techniques for growing and breeding heritage grains, harvesting seeds, and recipes for cooking these diverse grains, as well as the history and culture of grain cultivation. Joined by bakers, brewers, grain farmers, and seed visionaries, there will be interactive discussions, hands-on activities, and grainy teachings from instructors active in the fields of grains.

Classes occur on Thursdays from 2-4pm MT* starting September 30 and concluding November 18. All classes will be recorded for later viewing. **Daylight savings takes effect on November 7th.*



Course Structure

Grain School Online is our first course incorporating an incredible learning system, LearnDash. Discussion Forum

An important element to this 8-week program are the ongoing conversations sparked in the [Discussion Forum](#). The Discussion Forum presents an opportunity to converse with your classmates, facilitators, and guest presenters on one of our favorite subjects - grains!

There are three primary tasks we are requesting of students in the Discussion Forum.

1. Introductions

We want to know more about you. Share your reasons for joining this class, and any background information you would like your peers to know. We encourage fellow students to read and interact, and maintain these connections in your future work with grains.

2. Adopt-A-Grain Project - weekly

You will select a grain to 'adopt' and research throughout the course. Each week you will be prompted to investigate something specific about the grain and upload it to the Discussion Forum. At the end of the course you will have created a comprehensive portfolio of your chosen grain!

Adopt-A-Grain prompts will be uploaded every Saturday morning.

3. Discussion Prompts - weekly

Every week, there will be a topic to discuss, associated with the weekly content of the class. We hope you enjoy learning with and from your peers.

Discussion Forums prompts will be uploaded every Saturday morning.

Code of Conduct

Seeds represent the accumulated knowledge of countless generations of farmers and gardeners from traditional cultures around the world. Our Seed & Grain Schools encourage a deeper contemplation of the heritage and lineage of the seeds we steward by honoring traditional seed keepers and the indigenous origins of our seed diversity. Do I need to submit my assignments?

We aren't asking that you formally submit any of the assignments. We encourage you to engage with the Discussion Forums, and gather as much information about your grain in the Adopt-A-Grain Project as you'd like. We will be monitoring the Discussion Forum and engaging as facilitators and students, however, we are not making note of who is or is not engaging. These projects are not required, they are voluntary. After you read, review, or watch the resources offered in the Student Portal, please mark the module as complete!
